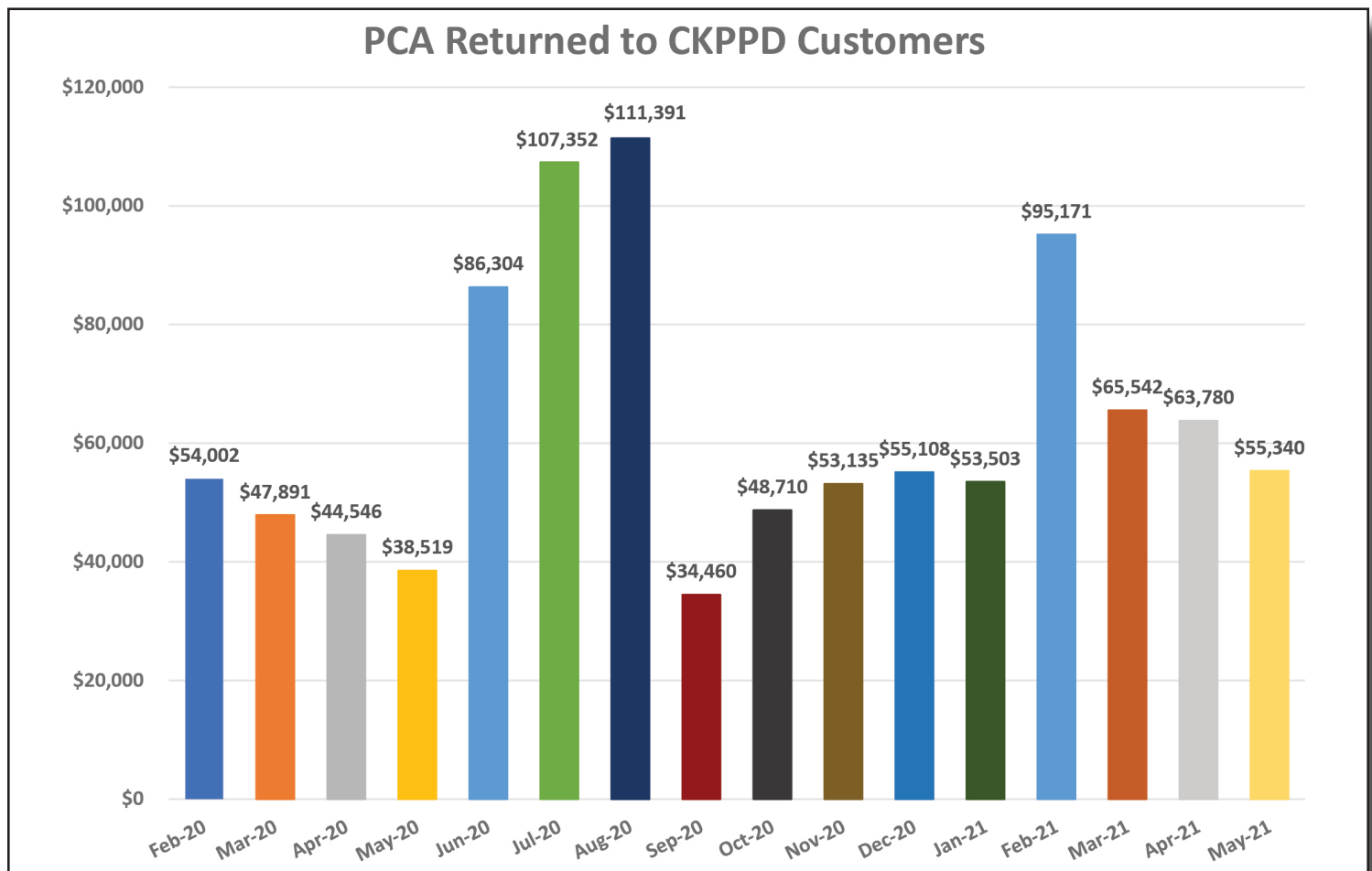


Return of Your Money

Over the last 16 months, you likely have noticed a Power Cost Adjustment (PCA) credit on your billing statement. Nebraska Public Power District, who supplies wholesale power to the District, is returning excess margins to its wholesale customers in the form of a PCA. PCA is a mechanism for truing up the difference between the cost of producing and transmitting electricity, and the revenue generated from the sale of electricity. The CKPPD Board of Directors voted to pass the PCA credit on to you – after all, it's your money! The PCA amount for each customer is calculated based on the number of kilowatt hours (KWH) consumed each month. This rate of return per KWH did increase after the first 12 months, as it is adjusted by NPPD each February, if applicable. The chart below shows the dollars that have been returned to qualifying customers since the PCA began back in February 2020. The PCA will continue through at least January 2022.

Don't fall victim to a scam!

Customers are reporting suspicious calls throughout Cedar-Knox PPD service territory. We do not call our customers "demanding immediate payment or be disconnected". Please be careful if you receive a call like this. If you do, please hang up and call Cedar-Knox PPD at 402-254-6291 to verify your account status.

Four signs that it is a scam:

- Scammers PRETEND to be from an organization you know
- Scammers say there's a PROBLEM or a PRIZE
- Scammers PRESSURE you to act immediately
- Scammers tell you to PAY in a specific way
