Watch for signs directing the flow of traffic and customer entrance to the west side soon. We appreciate your patience and understanding while we are in this interim space. Thank you.




Pole Inspections Begin Soon

Soon poles will be inspected in Cedar County, which will involve over 2,600 poles. The map (below) shows the approximate area that will be included in this year's inspection, which is from Hartington going north and east to Highway 12. Cedar-Knox PPD annually contracts with a company to perform evaluations of our poles each year. When we can proactively identify poles that pose a potential issue, we can replace them before they fail, which could possibly cause an outage. Global Utility Services will be doing the inspections this year. Please keep in mind this is a contracted

company, so they will be driving their own equipment, utilizing white trucks and/or four-wheelers.

Ways to Help Limit Tree Trimming

Did you know electric utilities are required to trim trees and other types of vegetation that grow too close to overhead power lines? We know you love your trees, and we will do everything we can to avoid trimming them.

Here's how you can help:

- 1. Plant trees in the right place. Trees that will be <40 ft. should be planted at least 25 ft. away from power lines (>40ft. should be at least 50 ft. away).

- **2. Don't block pad-mounted transformers.** Plant shrubs at least 10 ft. away from transformer doors and 4 ft. from transformer sides.



3. Report dangerous branches. If you spot a tree or branch that is dangerously close to power lines, please let us know.

Energy Efficiency Tip of the Month

Did you know using your dishwasher is more energy efficient than washing a load of dishes by hand? To maximize efficiency, wash full loads in the dishwasher and don't block the arms or other parts that move while the appliance is in use.

For additional savings, turn on the "air dry" setting instead of using the "heat dry" setting and use a rinse aid to help dishes dry faster without spotting and streaking.
